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A flutter on Orkney arts

Frances Anderson talks to artist Catherine Wells who decided to up sticks and go far north to start a new life and a business in Kirkwall

MOVING to the remote Orkney Isles isn't for everyone, but for artist Catherine Wells it was a dream come true. From her first visit to Orkney, she knew she wanted to live there.

"I have been fascinated with Orkney from a young age. It seemed a magical place full of the most amazing archaeological sites, Ness of Brodgar, Broch of Gurness, Ring of Brodgar, countless tombs and

lots more. I never dreamt I would have the pleasure of living here. After visiting on holiday a few times I knew I wanted to live here.

"Orkney has a magic about it that is hard to describe, it just sort of grabs you and doesn't let go. I visited other places in Scotland and

England to see if I liked them as much, but no, it had to be Orkney.'

Born and bred in Lancashire, Catherine ran a successful mosaic arts business from her studio at Higherford Mill, a studio collective of artists and ran regular mosaic and landscape needlefelt workshops.

"In February 2019, my van full to the brim, I found my self crossing the Pentland Firth to Orkney. I thought my business interests of art and

complementary therapy would fit in well here. I didn't know what to expect when I moved but was not disappointed and loved it from day one. Initially I lived in beautiful but rem ote Birsay on the West of Orkney, but moved to Kirkwall in December 2023 after acquiring business premises on the High Street in Kirkwall. Having a gallery/shop of my own has always been my dream", says Catherine.

large garden which I'm hoping to open up for folk to come and sit and contemplate through the summer. It needs more work but planning permissions and building warrants are in the process for all the changes I need to do.

"Opening the shop I started with the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds (RSPB) yearly nature event, featuring mixed media artists.

'It went well and I have been slowly progressing since then. It's a low key affair compared to the bigger shops on the high street, but folks have been very supportive of my efforts.

"I show other makers' work too, and am slowly

getting a reputation as a place to find something different. Running the shop and offering my complementary therapies in the back certainly keeps me busy, but it's been very well received in the town

"I was given the honour of hosting one of the hand made 'ba's' before Xmas in my window. This is a traditional rugby type game played twice a year on Xmas and New Year's Day. It's taken very seriously here and the fact it's my first year and I'm not Orcadian I felt was a very special event for me.

"There is a large artist community here and Kirkwall is very vibrant with quality shops and café s and lots going on. Even though I was locked down here during Covid like every one else, I was grateful to live in such a beautiful place. The best things are the way you can be yourself and people accept you. There doesn't seem to be much of a class system here and incomers are generally accepted as long as you make an effort to fit in.

"There are no traffic jams, not many lock their doors, and Orcadians are usually kind and honest and are happy to find the time to say hello and chat with you. For a lady on my own I felt very safe and relaxed and soon started to make friends. I love having a day out to visit one of the many Islands in the summer and will take my electric bike to cycle

"I am running workshops throughout the year which are usually very popular with folks from all over the globe, and this year I will be offering new full day workshops including hand embroidering existing clothes, needlefelt landscape pictures, crochet and wool rug hooking and rag hooking again using old clothes, all of which can be booked with me directly or on my Facebook page - Arts a Flutter. There has always been an eco friendly theme to my artwork, eco cards made from old books are very popular, as is upcycled lampshades, furniture and driftwood art. Folks like to see something unusual in my window."

So if you're visiting ancient Orkney be sure to visit this new shop and pick up something just that little bit different

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Editorial Comment

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Birmingham today...

ALONGSIDE this column a working musician expresses some of the horror that will be widely felt at the prospect of the city of Birmingham becoming a virtual music-free zone.

For the near bankrupt city council the situation may be all too understandable. Years of cuts have taken a massive toll on all services and, faced with withdrawing support from life and death services, aiding the arts may seem almost frivolous.

But, as pianist Gusztav points out, there are strong economic arguments for supporting the arts. It is an area of soft power in which Britain is particularly strong and our orchestras and musicians are at the forefront of this movement.

What must worry everyone who cares about our cultural life is that what is happening in Birmingham today could so easily happen nearer home tomorrow.

Take the BBC, for instance. The knife that has so fatally wounded local radio and reduced the strength of many news gathering departments could soon be poised over some of the many orchestras the BBC supports.

Maintaining an orchestra is a massively costly operation and an accountant looking for easy pickings will almost certainly start to ask questions.

In Scotland we need to be particuarly vigilant over the future of the wonderful BBC Scottish Symphony Orchestra.

Not all that many years ago, the BBC Scottish came under severe threat. A rearguard action was successful then in staving off the threat, but we need to be on our guard.

We also need to do all we can to support our musician friends and their employers, by both singing their praises and - whenever we can, now we are no longer Covid bound - getting out and paying to listen to their

In a very real sense the same applies to many other areas of the arts. The problems facing the Edinburgh International Festival have been well documented. As with so many other cultural undertakings, the continued existence of the Festival has been described as something of a 'miracle'.

We are going to need many miracles in the years ahead.

When the music ends...

We asked the pianist Gusztáv Fenyo for a personal reaction to the news that the city of Birmingham is planning to end all support for music in the city in years to come.

BIRMINGHAM City Council is proposing shocking and quite unprecedented damage to its classical institutions with cuts to organisations including the City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra (CBSO), Birmingham Opera Company, Birmingham Royal Ballet, British choir Ex Cathedra and B:Music, which will see all of them lose 50 per cent of their council grants this year and 100 per cent next financial year.

The cuts are part of an effort to fill a £ 300m budget gap for the council, which declared itself effectively bankrupt last year. For the Association of British Orchestras to express 'deep concern' at the impact of these cuts must be the greatest understatement in the musical world this century.

The proposed plan shows how little regard the elected representatives have for the cultural life of the region, for its artistic achievements, for the livelihoods of many hundreds of people and the enlightenment, pleasure and spiritual sustenance for many more.

It also bodes alarmingly for cultural organisations throughout the UK, as is already being seen elsewhere.

You cannot reduce the size of an orchestra, unless you turn it into something other than a symphony orchestra.

You cannot have a part-time orchestra because its best members will find work elsewhere and will not return to the CBSO.

You cannot reduce the number of concerts because this will decrease the revenue anyway. And you cannot just increase ticket prices because your

average concert-goer in the region will not be able to afford it. The same applies, in every way, to the opera and ballet companies.

Sir Simon Rattle began his great career building the CBSO into a world-class ensemble. rivalling not only London's, but many notable European and American orchestras. He put that city and that orchestra

The concert hall that was built for it, one of the world's finest, has amazing acoustics and facilities, the pride of the UK's second-largest city.

Decisions such as these are made by people who know the price of everything but the value of nothing.

Does anyone think of cutting allowances for MPs and the Lords?

Does anyone think of increasing taxes (Austria, Belgium and the Scandinavian countries all have higher rates and people live better), in particular for the rich (Patriotic Millionaires UK are begging to be taxed more)?

And if money is the only criteria, then why disregard the proven effect of such distinguished cultural bodies to drive much-needed inward foreign investment?

This is a shameful, cock-eyed, short-sighted approach with extremely damaging long-term consequences. The people making these decisions

should not be there; this government should not be there...fortunately, very soon,they will not be.

There may be hope here for the future of so many of our threatened churches. More creative uses than being boringly turned into dwelling houses could open up as we become an ever more secular society.


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The long march for peace

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Painter of war and peace

Thomas Hennell, less well known than '30s colleagues Eric Ravilious and Edward Bawden, is receiving long overdue recognition in a recent biography, plus an exhibition

I'M READING Jessica Kilburn's book Thomas Hennell, The Land and the Mind, published in 2021. It's fascinating, insightful, carefully researched, beautifully produced and illustrated. Matilda Bevan's exhibition 'Vein' at Berwick's Granary Gallery, inspired by Hennell, includes four of his works and some memorabilia.

The constellations were in particularly creative alignment in 1903, when three remarkable English artists were born: Edward Bawden on March 10, Thomas Hennell on April 16, and Eric Ravilious on July 22.

Fate brought them together again twentyeight years later, in 1931, at the Brick House in Great Bardfield, Essex, where Bawden and Ravilious were already ensconced as lodgers. Hennell was cycling round the country recording traditional farming practices, sleeping under hedges or in barns, researching for his book Change in the Farm. That evening he fancied a bath and proper bed. The three met over breakfast and hit it off immediately.

Their paths continued to cross for more than a decade. It was a difficult time for Hennell, who suffered a severe nervous breakdown in 1932, and spent the next he perfectly describes his words from Far From the three years in a succession of institutions. A big man, with tremendous energy and stamina, the coming of war released an extraordinarily productive period as an official war artist.

When his friend Ravilious was lost flying off Iceland in 1942 Hennell took his place, before being posted to Indonesia to record the Japanese surrender. He never came home, losing his life to nationalist forces in Java in 1945.

Hennell's star has not shone as brightly as those of his two friends in recent years, although he was recognised as outstanding in his lifetime by both National Gallery Director Kenneth Clark, and Tate Director John Rothenstein. Perhaps because he was never one to seek the limelight, although illness and a relatively short creative life will have played a part. Most of his work was undertaken in twelve active years. Also, I think, because his style was not innovative, or ground-breaking, or obviously modern.

He was simply a very good painter, of English country life and then of a nation at war, writing, in

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1943, that "Life is more urgent, more realistic in times of austere need as at present".

Lucky for him, and his contemporary, David Jones, that they both studied with A S Hartrick at Camberwell School of Art. He taught them economy with colour and paint, describing Jones as "leaving out everything but the magic."

Often, looking at Hennell's paintings of rural life, humans are so much part

of the landscape that, immersed in their work, they are scarcely separate beings, and sometimes hardly seen at all. Painting sheep shearing at Stinsford Farm near Dorchester in 1940, known to Thomas Hardy. Madding Crowd - "the barn was natural to the shearers, and the shearers were in harmony with the barn".

Physicists and mystics agree that at subatomic level there is no separation, only energy. Perhaps that is why Hennell's contemporary Carel Weight wrote that he went "deeper into his subject than any artist I have ever known". His paintings can have a wraith-like, ghostly quality, reminding us that he had been overwhelmed by "the other", seeing the unseen, imagining the unimaginable; and could be again. Shades of William Blake, his favourite poet

and seer. Hennell's work is delicate, complex, layered, diaphanous.

You need time to absorb, be immersed; then feel the energy, movement, and excitement! Take 'Rathcoursey House from Mad Dog Wood', painted in 1940 at his happy place, his friend John Smyth's estate overlooking Cork Harbour in Ireland. Chaotic, effulgent, the high summer greenery in the foreground feels as if it will fall out of the frame and overwhelm, entangle, trip, trap even. Escape is hinted at, taunting, tantalising, teasing with a glimpse of a yacht at anchor in the bay top left, and part of the big house top right.

Into McTaggart **Country**

Nick Jones on the Coquet River school

NEXT TIME you find yourself heading south from Edinburgh on the east coast main line, watch out for two striking landmarks to port, just south of Alnmouth; the tower crowning the keep of Warkworth Castle, and the extraordinarily elegant mushroom shaped Morwick water tower.

You're in McTaggart country. An Amble man through and through, Luke McTaggart, he of the 'Coquet River School' of artists, is well placed to observe and paint his native land, sea and

And does he paint! 'The Morwick Paintings', his recent exhibition at Alnwick Playhouse, show the river at Morwick, upstream from Amble, over a year to autumn 2023. They take you right into the changing moods and tenses of this hidden, wellwooded river-scape.

Acrylic can have an inert, flat, lifeless quality. Not here. Luke's work imbues the way water, moving or still, reflects light. A master of colour, capturing the extraordinarily vibrant acid green. bordering on yellow, of foliage in spring, he's equally adept and at home composing amongst Amble's housing estates, or riverside, using block of colour to draw out abstract patterns and shapes.

A dab hand with grey too. There's a lot of it about on the east coast, when sea, sky and land are obliterated by the steamy dampness of the haar. Below Morwick the Coquet snakes its way seaward, curve after curve, enjoying a last, long, lingering, embrace around Warkworth before toppling over the weir at the head of the estuary, where it stretches, straightens and slackens as it merges into the North

Had vou been here on July 6, 1935 you might have seen RMS Mauretania steaming north. The town clerk messaged "Greetings from Amble, last port in England, to the finest ship on the seas.'

Not for long, sadly, for it was off to the breakers' yard at Rosyth. Amble too was fast heading for dissolution. A busy coal-exporting port for a century, thousands of ships were loaded from its dockside staithes. The last shipment left in 1969, leaving the town forlorn and rudderless, searching

for a new identity.

No surprise that it began to appeal to artists, attracted by the magical mix of sea, seabirds, boats, light, and relatively affordable accommodation. Reinventing itself as "The Friendliest Port", arts and culture helped transform post-industrial angst and

An interesting, some might say quirky, place to live, work, visit, or moor your yacht. The enlightened Amble Development Trust has helped, willing and able to invest in tourism, the arts and culture, including the "Bord Waalk" sculpture trail, twelve site specific works inspired by the estuary's birds.

Luke had a head start, being Amble born and bred, but, these days, he's far from alone. It's tempting to say, these things just happen, but dig a bit and you'll usually find people with the vision, determination, commitment and inspiration to translate dreams into reality.

Take Dry Water Arts. It's an independent notfor-profit initiative, the brainchild of two inspiring, inspired people. Frances Anderson's creativity is literally immersive, inspired by water. She should know - she's swum the English Channel!

Paula Turner's inspiration is movement, dance, and

physical theatre. Formerly derelict, the building has been converted with such care and thought, making it welcoming, accessible, and dementia-positive. The programme embraces yoga, meditation, and dance, as well as exhibitions, workshops and events.

I saw recent work by Geoffrey Bradford, sculptor, and much more. Part owner of a light aircraft, his paintings and collages of Northumberland from the air show it in a different light; I just hope they weren't done hands-free of the joystick!

The word art seems old-fashioned and irrelevant here, where there is a recognition that human beings are naturally creative. It's all about allowing, encouraging and enabling people to express and release their 'inner Beethoven', regardless of mental or physical condition, or mayhem in the world outside.

Embedded in its community, a place for one and all, Frances and Paula have won trust and understanding for the arts and imagination, not as

an optional add-on, but a valid way of life, career and calling, central to the vitality and well-being of both individuals and their communities.



Forgotten painter's long life journey from Newburgh-on-Ythan to North Africa

JAMES MCBEY: unrecognised Scottish artistic genius or philandering war artist from the North East who died in Morocco leaving behind many questions unanswered of his rather dazzling unique and unexamined life?

A young Scottish/ Lebanese author and journalist, Alasdair Soussi, has set out to answer this question and his new book. Shadows and Light: The Extraordinary Life of James McBey, is helping to bring Newburgh, the birthplace of McBey, into the cultural hemisphere as an art tourist destination.

Soussi wrote the book during lockdown after being

quite astounded to discover when he was writing an article about something else that touched on Lawrence of Arabia and saw McBey's portrait

in the War Museum in London, that no-one else seemed to have written about him.

"This was about ten years ago and I couldn't

believe it when I saw it how beautifully it was painted, when I looked at the painter's name, I saw it was McBev, and I thought - that's either Irish or Scottish – I hoped it was Scottish since I am Scottish too.

"When I realised he was Scottish I looked him up and was blown away to discover that there was so little in existence written about him. in fact the only book in publication was a book that he himself had written.

"That book was only 100 pages long - but it had me hooked, not only was he a brilliant artist, but Mcbey had an incredible talent with words too."

Soussi is now the proud author of the first all encompassing biography

McBev and has travelled extensively promoting his book, in Tangiers and Scotland.

He also curated an exhibition at the Aberdeen Art Gallery last spring promoting the work of McBev and his own book. Shadows and Light.

There were many reasons that drew Soussi to expanding McBey's life story: he was totally fascinated by the young

Scot who abandoned a job as a bank clerk in Aberdeen to study at Gray's School of Art at the end of the World War I.

'When I looked at the man, I discovered that James McBey had led the most unique life, a cinematic life, a unique life a rags to riches life, that begins in Victoria's Scotland in 1883 in North east Scotland and ends in postwar Morocco in 1959 and I thought - Wow what happens in that

"I just could not fathom that this man was not only an amazing adventurer who travelled the globe, but he was also considered one of the great artists of the 20th century.

"I thought it was fitting my book was published by a publisher based in Scotland. It's hard nowadays being a writer and extra hard to get a book deal, but I did manage this in the first

"Although McBey was a Scot he wasn't, quote unquote, a parochial Scot, he was an International Scot" Soussi observed.

"He had a very interesting family background, very multi-faceted. He carried a lot of baggage - being born to a single mother, being born illegitimately. Being born to parents nowadays who aren't married is not a big deal. Now in fact people don't even use the phrase 'illegitimate,' but it was actually written on his birth certificate. He carried that with him all his life; he carried the fact that he didn't feel loved his whole life," revealed Soussi.

"His mother seemed to have had what we could call today depression. Mental health problems. She lost her vision, she started to go blind in her late 20s. There was nothing they could do for her, the illness that she had is easily treated today but back then the only thing they could give her to treat was leeches, he said.

"By the time we get into early 1900s Annie Gillespie, the daaughter of a blacksmith was blind. Tragically Annie took her own life and hanged herself when she was 45. Mcbey was in his early 20s, at this time. He found her body in early morning in 1906 and he cut her down and this haunted him and this impacted, him throughout his life not surprisingly" Soussi continued

"He was a very handsome guy and had a lot of different relationships,

Some would say he was a womaniser, he kept 50 years of diaries, and many of his affairs are detailed in the diaries.'

McBey's spiritual home is probably Aberdeen Art Gallery, as that's where the bulk of his archive is kept.

McBey's wife outlived James by 40 years as she was 20 years younger and after he died she spent a lot of time preserving his legacy - she wrote out a code sheet to explain his diary.

"He was brought up in the presbyterian confines of Scotland

Although he spent many years in Morocco, where he died, he would never work on a Sunday. This is what makes him very multi-layered, complex. Art was the love of his life.'

As Soussi writes in the biography, he says: "I'm not writing a hagiography

He had a lot of flaws but the biggest flaw was how he treated women

He was a bit cavalier with his feelings. He got three women pregnant. But that's because he wanted to be loved and he didn't get love from his mother He was always looking for female approval just to be recognised and love was one of the things that propelled him" Soussi declared.

"This man should be seen in the same eyes as Burns and Sir Walter Scott" Soussi believes.

"Anyone who is described as an heir to Whistler and Rembrandt should have a special place in history. One of the things that should be remembered is that he was an international Scot.

"He was certainly very international. Born by the North Sea, he blazed a trail from Scotland to America, across the Middle East,

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

Culture wars: shock news from the front - from an insider

THE ARTS COUNCIL is no more. Following a series of high level navelgazing sessions in partnership with the GROAN (Get Rid Of Art Now) Foundation, an ultra right-wing think-tank, its senior executive voted unanimously to abolish themselves with immediate effect, having taken the precaution of freezing all assets and outstanding grants before being floated offshore to a pension fund in an undisclosed Caribbean tax haven.

The official announcement references realisation that the arts are "now considered elitist, narrowly defined. retrograde, potentially subversive, divisive, inappropriate, and unfit for purpose..." and that "...there is no place for imagination in the age of Artificial Intelligence.'

Arts, Heritage and Tourism have been subsumed within the Ministry of Culture, Media and Sport. In future DCMS will concentrate on supporting more broadbased and socially inclusive initiatives, like gambling, game-shows, reality TV, and croquet.

A Treasury spokesman welcomed the announcement, adding that it supported any initiatives that involved not spending or,

worse, not wasting public funds.

Another DCMS spokesman, when asked for a comment, looked quite mystified, saying "I have no idea what you are talking about. The word art is a meaningless historical construct that is no longer relevant to modern life."

This view appears to have been corroborated by recent opinion polls which confirmed that 80 per cent wondered whether and where you could buy "the arts" on-line, and who the influencers were. Ten per cent thought it was a long running soapopera, while six per cent couldn't agree on what constituted 'Art'.

The remaining 10 per cent didn't understand the question.

An independent columnist observed "This makes total sense to me. Risk, challenge, innovation, imagination and the seeking of new ways to define and realise the power of truth are intrinsic to arts, creativity and culture.

"If they get kicked out of the pram, you might as well get rid of the pram as well. And stop calling it a pram to boot."



Escape to the art hut in the hills

IF YOU'RE LOOKING to escape the daily hustle and bustle and to indulge your creative side then check out Comrie Art Hut, a new venue for art courses and retreats located in beautiful Comrie. Perthshire.

Run by local artist and tea expert Beverly Wainwright, the hut welcomes anyone with an interest in being creative and in the arts. A variety of courses are on offer from week long artist bookmaking and drawing courses to weekend mosaics. Beverly has worked as an artist for most of her life.

"After studying geology at university, I worked as a potter in East Lothian for several years before starting a family. I then moved into photography, working for a small local paper but going on to running photography businesses.

"I took a career break and worked as a VSO volunteer in Sri Lanka, working as a business adviser with farmers in a remote rural area. During this time I met the owner of a tea estate in the mountains. When I finished my voluntary post I was offered a job to develop livelihoods and turn around the struggling fortunes of a tea estate.

"I spent six years living and working at Amba Estate, learning about tea growing and production, set up a small tea factory, and a tourism operation providing stable employment in a very poor rural

area. Since then I have set up several tea factories and helped new tea businesses develop new teas.

The Art Hut is the former Scottish Tea Factory in Comrie where I processed tea from tea plants grown in Scotland by Scottish growers. I ran this as a micro tea factory for six years, however tea is so rare in Scotland that it wasn't commercially viable for me to keep running it, although I'll continue to do consultancy work to help fund the Art Hut.

"I wanted to start a new business in the tea factory building and after taking art courses at Bridge House Art in Ullapool and Leigh School of Art, running courses and workshops in the hut seemed a great idea.

"I'll be working with different artists and makers from around Scotland. The space is light, peaceful and welcoming and is situated at Comrie Croft, which is a well-known mountain biking centre with accommodation, shop and café in the summer months. The summer and autumn programmes will expand over the next few years as will the variety of courses on offer."

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
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
