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
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
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Out of the Shadows

Cathy Bell on an artist long undiscovered

SOMETIMES artists with great talent go without credit or recognition on a worldwide platform. This can happen for several reasons, perhaps the individual was not pushy enough or interested in self-promotion, or maybe they were in the wrong place at the wrong time.


In the case of the French painter Louis Fortunet, it was probably the former reason. According to a small book dedicated to the life and career of Fortunet (Louis Fortunet, From the Shadows to the Light by Richard Jacques) the author explains that he was a simple man who was reserved by nature". It is also true to note that the latter option was not the case since Fortunet was certainly in the right place at the right time as far as being an artist was concerned.

Born in 1904, Louis grew up in the small town of Ceret in southern France, a town well known for its artistic associations. Those years during the first half of the twentieth-century have been well documented, Ceret has been cited as the Mecca of Cubism, a place where modern movements in art first came into being.

One of the artists who lived and worked in Ceret was the Russian painter Chaim Soutine and, according to the book, Fortunet had been given access to the studio of Soutine when he was a teenager. Writing in the preface of the book Alain Ribes states "I like to imagine the moment when this teenager was allowed to for the first time push open the doors of the grandmaster's workshop".

It is believed that, because of this experience, Fortunet was immediately struck by the desire to paint, which he did for the rest of his life. He was the only young artist allowed to paint in the studio, it is even suggested that he was taught to paint by Soutine himself.

His sister Therese modelled for Soutine's painting The Girl in Red and as a young girl in her early teens she also ran errands for the artist, young Louis and his friends were known to keep guard at Soutine's studio door while the artist painted sides of raw meat, apparently the neighbours had been complaining about the smell.



However, after being initiated at a young age into the world of art and painting, Fortunet became a nurse, unlike his friend who helped to guard the studio door Camile Decossy who later became Director of the Beaux-Arts de Montpellier.

So although Fortunet did not fully immerse himself in the art world he continued to paint all his life, during the 1950's he could be seen with his easel set up in and around the area, particularly in Ceret and the nearby coastal town of Collioure. His environment was his subject, the landscape of Vallespir, "the roofs of Ceret, villages, ponds, small ports, boats and fisherman's huts".

It is clear that he was content to depict what he saw around him as his subject matter. He declared that he did not see why he should go looking for subjects when everything he had in front of him inspired him as it had inspired Picasso, Soutine, Kremenge, Marchand and Herbin. So, Fortunet continued to paint the "small stone walls and gardens, the countryside with its olive trees, cherry trees and cork oak

He participated in many exhibitions throughout his life, his first exhibiting experience came in 1958 when the patron of the Grand Café in Ceret

Catherine Erre invited him to exhibit around forty paintings. After this Fortunet continued to exhibit in France and also abroad, he held successful exhibitions in Cannes and Germany, for example. In 2009 the Musé e d'Art de Ceret exhibited four paintings by him in the exhibition Ceret, A Century of Sublime Landscapes.

This is said to be official recognition of the painter who, on this occasion, rubbed shoulders with the greatest painters of the twentieth-century. Yet, although not internationally known, Fortunet's memory and his legacy still resonate, some of his paintings can be found on the walls of Ceretan houses to this day. There is also a street named after him in the town. Rue Louis Fortunet, And, although he did not herald any new advances in painting he was born to paint, he was an artist rooted in his surrounding environment.

To quote Richard Jacques the author of the book "Fortunet sings of his native country and sings well

with accents that sound right that give his paintings a beautiful and healthy atmosphere, that smell of the soil, the true soil, the one that will never be adulterated".

Heritage Under Threat

Glasgow School of Art – under a shroud of secrecy – and inaction

Clare Henry reports on a depressing conference in Glasgow

ONE EXPECTS a symposium to provide information for experts from experts. In June, 100+ people came to Glasgow's Mackintosh Society's Heritage Under Threat to hear 20 speakers. There were some terrific talks. But the elephant in the room from the word go was Glasgow School of Art. Mackintosh's beloved. iconic creation which went on fire, not once but twice.

No one mentioned it, but hoped for news, Elizabeth Hopkirk of SAVE Britain's Heritage, Niall Murphy, director Glasgow City Heritage Trust and Fiona Sinclair of the Alexander Thompson Society have all looked life in the eye, facing danger of destruction of major building by uncaring councils, landlords

They provided a realistic call to arms for protecting Britain's heritage. Inspiring speakers, like Rob Kendall, trustee of Mackintosh's Derngate, recounted some

The raison d'être for the Society's 1973 foundation - I was there - was to establish a group ready to speak out, to protect, promote and champion Mackintosh at a time when several of his buildings were due for demolition.

Fifty years later Mandy Fallens and Liz Davidson described the challenges of ageing Mackintosh buildings and use of new technology to help. Others highlighted the irony of conflicting legislation, surprising drawbacks of being a listed building, legal loopholes or unhelpful

Voices pleaded for planning to be more helpful to old buildings, citing occasions when rubbish bin location trumped survival! Arson is a common problem, used if pleas for official demolition fails.

GSA's restoration was almost

complete when an intense second fire in 2018 caused fundamental destruction. Worse was to follow. It recently emerged that, due to foolhardy behaviour on the part of GSA, the insurers had legitimate reasons to refuse pay out. The School was forced into arbitration.

Meanwhile, despite the fact that GSA has publicly committed to rebuilding, to 'faithful reinstatement, faithful reconstruction" no architect has yet to be appointed. After a decade, with huge increase in cost of materials since

The three year old **Business Plan needs** updating. But still no architect. And it seems, no insurance.

Brexit, it's likely £250 million would be insufficient.

The wave of worldwide public sympathy which produced millions after the 2014 fire turned to anger in 2018, so it's unlikely people will respond a second time. Moreover, funds raised in 2014 were not spent on anything Mackintosh, but to buy additional building stock.

With little progress, a wall of silence, total lack of transparency, and in view of the insurance bombshell, delegates waited with bated breath for GSA director and CEO Penny Macbeth to explain exactly what was happening.

They might as well have stayed home. Glasgow. Macbeth's rose-tinted vision was almost insulting to delegates. She skirted round

anything to do with the School, painting an idealised picture of a flourishing, vibran Glasgow where anything was possible.

She obviously never walks down depressingly boarded-up Sauchiehall Street or speaks to struggling shopkeepers or bankrupt businessmen. She waxed lyrical about her previous job, Manchester Art School, where money was no problem. She talked about collaboration, mutual support and 'pulling together' - when she herself has done none of those.

Her minder Scott Parsons, Director of Strategy, was there to watch her words. The previous day he also turned up to monitor Eleanor Magennis, who is actually coached in her presentations. As director of GSA Estates Infrastructure she has the difficult job of talking up the situation.


She echoed "bringing it back" at least a dozen times, quickly listing the need for "an architect, cost consultant and financial advisor." Her most comforting information came via slides, images showing Narro Structural Engineers' stabilising steel brace designed by Dominic Echlin, which holds the building up, preventing the Mack imploding. He is GSA's guardian angel.

The white wrap, "Not a shroud Eleanor said, will help GSA dry out in three years. "Penny wants a working graduate school. Penny wants a life drawing room. Penny wants to bring it back," she repeated. But neither she nor Penny explained how this was to be achieved.

MacBeth did admit "We will re-run the costs, how the building is phased." The three year old Business Plan needs updating. But still no architect. And it seems, no insurance.

Nick Jones tracks down a mysteriously registered car and the enterprising and didactic venture behind it

THE WEEK before the election, a Guardian article asked if there could be a brighter future ahead for the arts and arts education, after years of dwindling support from successive governments.

Around the same time Clive Myrie, talking on Desert Island Discs, revealed that one of the first things he does after getting back from reporting from the front line of a war zone is to go to an art gallery or to a concert. Why? To re-connect with the humanity embodied in art and music, an antidote to destruction or despair.

It seems he's far from alone. Fortunately, the creative spirit cannot be quashed. It never has been. You just have to look for it. Here in Berwick-upon-Tweed, back in 1873, a certain James Wallace established an independent art school. Ninety students attended in the first year. In year two students submitted over a thousand works to an exhibition in London. It went from strength to strength.

The school helped launch the careers of Wallace's son, James junior, who won a scholarship to the Royal College of Art, as well as Frank Wood, whose

I was intrigued. Who drove the Jagartmobile? An eighty-two year old Jaguar-loving artist, perhaps? Meeting James Alexander Gaffney and his admin assistant Jan, later, I began to understand Initials+Inspiration+Year Born.

Here was someone autistic, with ADHD, who, once possessed by and addicted to alcohol and drugs, had found a way out by connecting with his inner artist. This not only released him but also led to an inspired sharing of the power of creativity.

The courage, determination, and generosity that James embodies clearly attracts others to benefit from his vision: "Inspire to be Inspired". Meaning, setting up hands-on workshops for people of all ages, backgrounds and abilities to make art and, at the same time, to help with their individual challenges, like a recent project in Eyemouth, "Skills for Life Multiply", supported by the Scottish Borders Council.

Participants created artworks to improve numeracy, for example measuring, cutting, designing and painting a box for their "Inspiration" quotes. "Fun with a ruler" involved creating a sailing boat, measuring each part exactly to make the perfect vessel. Shading and grading a hand drawn mandala embraced better mental health, mindfulness, and numeracy. The workshops were hosted by Eyemouth Marine, and also involved the St Abbs lifeboat team and "Thomas Tunnock", their 900W RIB lifeboat, named after their major funder, the famous teacake makers hailing from Uddingston, south east of Glasgow.

Tunnocks came to the rescue when the RNLI ceased its operation there. One of many benefits from this project? New artwork, presented to the lifeboat station.

The current programme includes Saturday Art Classes and an exhibition of more than two hundred pieces in Paxton House, along with Drop-In Workshops, a Junior Jag Art Academy, and Sunday art class at Berwick Youth Hostel. Each workshop is bespoke, adapted by James to meet participants' individual situation, from nursery one day to a care home the next.

Now an episodic film Shadows of the Boathouse, is being made, on location at Paxton. It has given participants all kinds of opportunities to express their creativity including designing and making 18th century costumes, acting, filming and writing screenplay.

The 'shadows' refer to the emotional

Seeing Eye to Eye with Raeburn

The great portraitist remembered on the bicentenary of his death in an eloquent exhibition in Kirkcudbright's fine 'Town Ḥall' galleries

MENTION THE NAME Henry Raeburn and images of sedate, early 19th century Scottish men, professors, judges, generals and Highland chieftains, spring to mind. Added to these is the wacky, skating Reverend Robert Walker, whose profile, printed on carrier bags and coasters, has become The Scottish National Gallery's logo. The thoughtful portrait of violinist Neil Gow is another treasure, as are representations of doughty, bonneted matrons.

There's a lot more to Raeburn. Over a 35 year career, this largely self-taught Edinburgh artist, whose life spanned the Scottish Enlightenment, painted some 1,000 portraits. Some of the most engaging are of the young. was particularly talented in painting young women in fashionable, high-waisted, muslin dresses with low necklines and vivacious, spontaneous children.

A fraction of the artist's output (40 portraits) is on show until September 29 at the Kirkcudbright Galleries. This bi-centenary commemoration of Henry Raeburn's death is the first celebration of his work since the major exhibitions in Scotland and London in 1997and has been staged by Kirkcudbright 2000 Ltd and Kirkcudbright Galleries (run by Dumfries & Galloway Council).

Curator, Amanda Herries is responsible for this remarkable show. Her emphasis on the artist's less well-known works, many of a private, domestic nature, is inspiring.

"We were lucky," she writes, "to find some Raeburns still in private hands, and it is wonderful to show them, fresh, to a wide audience. They've come from all over Scotland and England and we've worked hard to bring them together."

Usually restricting himself to recording a sitter's head and upper part of the body, the artist isn't renowned for his figure-work. But a magnificent 1822 full-length portrait in this exhibition belies that assumption. Still owned by the same family, the portrait is of Stair Hathorn Stewart. Handsome in

fashionable, skin-tight trousers, he holds the reins of his status symbol, a horse.

Significantly, perhaps, the family owned a Raeburn portrait of Stewart's wife, but it was sold in 1910 when American buyers paid fabulous prices for the artist's work.

Another portrait (c.1812-15) in the hands of the sitters' descendants at Arniston House, is of General Francis Dundas and his wife, Eliza playing chess. More than a portrait, this painting has an amusing and touching narrative as it shows the wife's satisfaction in check-mating her unsuspecting husband.

Althea Dundas Bekker of Arniston and her daughter, Henrietta are accustomed to lending their paintings for exhibitions. The portrait of their chess-playing ancestors has travelled widely. Shortly after Althea inherited Arniston, none other than 'The White House' of America asked to bor-

"It was scary seeing it borne away in the furniture van heading for the airport to fly to the US!" she writes. "I think Nixon was the President then and they invited us to tea but we refused because we were busy bringing in the harvest.'

Over the past 200 years, the fortunes of many of these sitters' families have ebbed. During Raeburn's career, Scotland prospered globally through trade and industry. With so much money sloshing around, some of it gained through the enslavement of Africans in the Caribbean, sugar and tobacco merchants commissioned portraits of themselves and their families.

This exhibition features a portrait of Colin Campbell of Park, who headed a family firm of West India merchants, and his wife, Ann. Colin and Ann's portraits were bequeathed by Isabella A.H.J. Campbell to Glasgow City Council in 1917. Others in this show were acquired by The National Gallery of Scotland, The National Trust of Scotland and The University of Edinburgh.

In one or two cases, they were bequeathed in lieu of death duties and one, a portrait owned by the Campbells of Craigie is, at the moment, up for sale through Angus Haldane Fine Art.

Undoubtedly, the effort expended in sleuthing the provenance of these paintings has been enormous and Herries is indebted to David Mackie who, in his unpublished PhD thesis in six volumes at Edinburgh University (1993), has helped to identify portraits and information about sitters and their families.

An unfinished portrait, the only one of Raeburn's in existence and in private hands, is of Sir John Maxwell of Pollok. Begun in the year before the artist's death, it lay in Raeburn's studio until Maxwell's nephew, Sir William Stir-

ling Maxwell, an art historian and collector of Spanish masters, which can still be viewed at Pollok House. bought it from Raeburn's descendants in 1877.







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




In her book, 'Henry Raeburn The Mirror of Scotland', (£ 12 at reception). Herries describes how the artist worked. Intuitively, 'without measuring or sketching, starting with an outline of the forehead, chin, nose and mouth, working on the face first.'

This exhibition also explores the role portraiture has played since the earliest of times. Herries compares Raeburn's period with our own, avowing that both are imageobsessed. Two hundred years ago, the affluent sat once only to be recorded in paint, whereas today the digitallycreated 'selfy' democritises portraiture, by producing endless images.

This is a modest, clever show that gives the public a chance to see the humanity and practice of an artist who competes easily with his peers, such as Allan Ramsay, Thomas Gainsborough, George Romney, Joshua Reynolds and Thomas Law-

It's amazing how Kirkcudbright's small, regional gallery can pack such a punch with an exhibition that throws light on a world-class artist, Scotland's foremost portrait painter.

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

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
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

A massive granite complex?

ABERDEEN'S Marischal College is said to be the second largest granite complex in the world. Some half of it has been successfully re-purposed by Aberdeen City, the Police and others.

Aberdeen University (who own the whole complex) have unaccountably failed to acknowledge their responsibility for the other half of these marvellous iconic city center C19 buildings.

The huge ceremonial Mitchell Hall remains dusty and abandoned. The astonishing Collections (including ever popular Egyptian mummies) continue to reside in storage racks unseen by the public since 2008.

The University needs to engage with the public and explain publicly what their plans are. There are rumours of relocation to a store in Old Aberdeen on the University campus. But why the secrecy? The public is still not getting to see what rightfully is theirs to enjoy, and belongs as much to the citizens of Aberdeen as the University.

Legally, of course, the University has no obligation to open their Collections to the public as they are for research and education, but that is surely no excuse.

Perth has just re-opened its Museum after a £27m revamp. Inverness is busy preparing to do the same. Of the 14 University museums in Scotland only two are shut. One (Glasgow School of Art) has been burnt twice! (see page 5) - the other is

There is some concern that parts of the Collection are of 'colonial' origin and therefore are distasteful to those who subscribe to fashionable sensibilities. Fine no problem, they do not need to be on show and the Museum has begun an admirable process of repatriation, handled with tact and skill.

Edinburgh has opened its collections of musical instruments. The Hunterian in Glasgow is one of the great museums of the world. Why has Aberdeen lost the place and abandoned its superb museum?

Successive Principals have given little or no priority to the museum. The University overspent on the new Library. They have been amateurish in engaging with potential donors from the Oil Industry.

Are Alumni taken seriously? Does the University Court engage fully with the senior management? There is no doubt the current financial situation is challenging. Yet any entrepreneur – Aberdeen is good at producing them – would tell you that a difficult time is the moment for bold and ambitious action. Sharing the problem with business and others from outside the University is surely the way forward. This is too big a problem just for the University.

The 2022 Donelson report proposed an option of a 'Creative Cluster' – a dynamic hub for public engagement including a museum, exhibition, events, ceremonial, and performance space, as well as creative incubator/start-up spaces.

There have been suggestions as to how this concept could be prudently developed to address an everchanging demand which may be difficult to com-prehend for the long term. Nonetheless, it would be a thoroughly proper use of public funds to attract visitors and create the spin-off to revitalise the centre of the city.


Many artists will have been familiar with the chaotically busy studio full of the latest photographic tech from which such beautiful results emerged.

Chris and Calum were responsible for many practical and technical innovations when they worked together in Aberdeen during the early days of the offshore oil boom.

During that period they ran the first automated transparency film processing north of the Central Belt and the first commercial Cibachrome printing facility outside of

Calum, an ever friendly fount of knowledge, will be much missed by the artistic community he served. It is hoped the name will long live on through the business.






